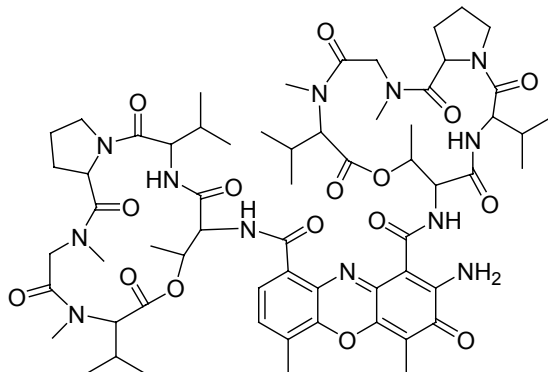


Actinomycin D

Application Notes

Actinomycin D is the most studied member of a family of unique bicyclic depsipeptides produced by several *Streptomyces* species. The depsipeptides are linked by a heterocyclic benzoxazine "anchor" that gives the metabolites a highly distinctive red/orange colour. Actinomycin D exhibits potent antibiotic and antitumor activity acting by DNA intercalation leading to the inhibition of nucleic acid synthesis. Tumor cell death has been demonstrated to occur by apoptosis.
